### Example 1: Assessment by Age Group

## Example 2: Assessing Each Building Block by Ministry Area

In another copy of the chart, enter the averages of all responses. This will help you identify areas of strength and areas of weakness or opportunity. Repeat for the other Building Blocks of Faith.

Enter a number from 1 to 5 in each of the boxes:

1=disagree strongly, 2=disagree, 3=neutral, 4=agree, 5=agree strongly
