- 15) Why is it important to be part of the Church?
- 16) How do we live as members of the Church?
- 17) What is a sacrament?
- 18) What sacraments do we practice in the Reformed tradition?

- 20) Why is the Lord's Supper important?
- 21) What does it mean to be Reformed? What are some differences between Reformed Christians and other denominations or traditions of Christians?
